

# Indiana University South Bend Intramural Sports 2-Person Golf Scramble Rules

## General Policies

### WAIVERS

Each participant is required to read and sign a WAIVER form before they can participate. The university assumes **NO medical or financial responsibility for any voluntary participation in intramural sports**. The university encourages all intramural participants to maintain their own health and/or accident insurance, as well as insurance to cover personally owned equipment.

### ELIGIBLE PLAYERS

- A. Students who are registered for classes, pay IU South Bend tuition, and have valid Student Activities Center (SAC) memberships
- B. Faculty and staff (*not* faculty and staff spouses) who have valid SAC memberships
- C. Dues-paying members of the IU South Bend Alumni Association who have valid SAC memberships
- D. Participants listed on a team/individual the entry forms located at the front desk of the SAC
- E. (Team sports) Players added at any time during the regular season, providing they have not already played for another team. Teams can add a player at game time, provided he/she has proper identification. This player's name is then added to the team roster, after checking eligibility. Rosters are frozen for teams participating in playoffs. Players must have participated in at least one regular-season game to be eligible to participate in a playoff game.
- F. Students, faculty, and staff who can present a **valid IU South Bend picture identification (ID)** card to the game official prior to the start of the game or event. **If an IU South Bend student/faculty/staff picture ID is not presented, the participant cannot play.**
- G. IU South Bend Alumni Association members who can present a valid **SAC membership card and a valid form of picture identification** (e.g., driver's license, state ID, etc.)

## Rules and Regulations

United States Golf Association (USGA) rules will be used with modifications or exceptions indicated in this document

### 1. Scramble Format

- a. Participants will play a 2 person scramble format.
- b. Each player will hit his or her tee ball to begin each hole.
  - i. A minimum of 5 tee shots must be used by each player on the team
- c. The team will choose the best shot and from that spot each player will hit his or her second shot.
- d. This format will continue until completion of the hole and a single score is recorded.
- e. Upon completion of the round, the 18 hole total will be the team's overall score.

### 2. Holing of a shot

- a. The holing of any shot constitutes the end of the hole for that team and the score at that point becomes final.

- i. This situation typically becomes an issue when a team having a particular putt has a player miss the putt and decided to make the “tap-in” before the second player has an opportunity at the original putt.

### 3. **Improving your Lie**

- a. Each participating team must mark the spot of each selected shot with either a golf tee or divot repair tool.
- b. At that time both members of the team may lift, clean and place their golf ball according to the stipulations listed below:
  - i. Fairway - The ball may be placed one club length from the spot of the selected ball no nearer the hole. When placed, the ball must remain in the fairway
  - ii. Rough - The ball may be placed one club length from the spot of the selected ball no nearer the hole. The placement of the ball may improve the team’s stance, swing and line of sight but must not be placed outside the one club length limit. When placed the ball must remain in the same cut of rough that the selected ball came to rest in.
  - iii. Hazard - The ball may be placed one club length from the spot of the selected ball no nearer the hole. The placement of the ball may improve the team’s stance, swing and line of flight but must remain within the one club length limit and remain in the same hazard the selected ball came to rest in. In regards to sand traps, the trap may be raked before placement of the ball.
  - iv. Putting Green - The selected ball may be placed one putter-head length from the spot of the selected ball no nearer the hole.

### 4. **Tee Boxes**

- a. Men will tee off from the white tees
- b. Women will tee off from the red tees

### 5. **Scoring**

- a. At the completion of play all teams are to sign and attest their respective scorecards and turn them into the Tournament Director.
- b. Each scorecard must have the signature of the scorer as well as a signature from the participating team.

### 6. **Tie Breaking Procedure**

- a. A “card off” will be used to break any ties
- b. The total score will be added up on the #1,2,3,4,5,6 handicap holes
  - i. Low score will win
- c. If tie still exists; The scores starting on the #7 through #18 handicapped ranked holes will be used to determine the winners.
